Our aim is to improve the quality of education in primary schools in rural Kenya by ensuring that schools are equipped to deliver an education worth having.



What we do

We upgrade schools and then build long-term relationships that provide on-going support wherever it is needed.



We partner with a cluster of schools in the isolated and rural Kasigau region of southeast Kenya.

This October marks a decade that I've been supporting schools in Kasigau, going back to October 2006 when, having only recently graduated, I spent six months managing a £20,000 project to upgrade and extend Jora Primary School.

The 10 years since have been an incredible journey both personally and for African Promise, which was born out of this experience in Jora in early 2008. There have been exhilarating highs and challenging lows, mistakes made and lessons learned, and many lifelong friendships formed. However I have never been prouder of the charity, of our dedicated and talented teams, and of our partner schools than I am now. When I started that project at Jora I never imagined that it would lead to this point; a charity supporting seven schools and more than 2,500 pupils. It is a true privilege to serve the Kasigau community and the wonderful people that call it home (such as Hilder, with whom I am pictured below.)

Of course, all that has been achieved over the last 10 years has only been possible due to the support of a great number of people: my parents, Trustees past-and-present, our small team in Kenya, and the many people and organisations that have raised or donated funds or contributed in other ways.

I am very excited about what the next year holds in store for the charity and what this could mean for our work going forward. I hope you will continue to support us on our journey as we seek to have an even greater impact on the education and lives of even more children in Kasigau. Enjoy the report!

We help schools to deliver an education worth having...

Primary education was made free in Kenya in 2003. This set the country on the path to achieving the Millenium Development Goal of universal primary education. However the reality of a government funded education for over 6 million pupils in more than 25,000 schools is that limited financial resources are spread very thinly when faced with the demands of employing sufficient teachers, providing adequate resources and investing in facilities and infrastructure.

In schools, particularly those in rural areas, this manifests itself in high class numbers, dilapidated classrooms, a lack of sufficient teachers, and an acute shortage of even the most basic learning resources. Since 2008 African Promise has been working in the Kasigau community of south-east Kenya, removing barriers to learning for children and equipping schools to deliver an education worth having.

This work is translating to steady improvements in a number of key measurements: increased enrolment, reduced absenteeism, more teachers & classrooms, lower class sizes, and, ultimately, improved performance and attainment levels too.

Did you know?

In 2015/16, public primary schools were allocated a budget of just £10 per pupil. This included £1.40 for textbooks, 70p for infrastructure development, and 10p for computers and IT equipment!

In 2015/16 we had a record breaking year...

Highlights of the year included:

- The launch of major project to redevelop a seventh partner school.
- The expansion of our lunch programme to reach all 2,400 pupils across existing six partner schools.
- The completion of our 58th classroom build/ upgrade project.
- Cumulative fundraising income since we were founded in 2008 passed £1million.
- Record annual expenditure of £186,247, of which 97% was on charitable activities.

In 2015/16 we launched a major new school upgrade...

Ngambenyi Primary became our seventh partner school in June 2015 with the launch of a £100,000 project to expand and upgrade the school. We are redeveloping the entire school to create a highquality facility which we hope will be a model for future school developments. Although not the largest single project we have ever undertaken, we are confident that it will be the best. At the time of writing (September 2016), the project was in its final stages and on course for completion in a few weeks. We are very much looking forward to showing off the results of over a year of hard work by our project management and building team in our next Annual Report. In 2015/16 we doubled the size of our meal programme...

Background

Our meal programme provides children in our partner schools with a daily lunch, keeping their minds and bodies fuelled for learning. Without this meal these children would go through the school day without any food, severely impacting on both their well-being and their education. By providing a daily lunch to children in school we remove hunger as a barrier to learning.

Achievements & plans

In May 2015 we doubled the scope of the programme to reach all of the pupils across our current partner schools. This year will be the first full school year in which we have provided a daily meal to every pupil; this equates to nearly half a million meals. From September, once our redevelopment of Ngambenyi is complete, we will further extend the programme to its 125 pupils.





In 2015/16 we gave pupils once in a lifetime experiences...

Background

A quality education is not just about providing sufficient classrooms, teachers and books; it is also about providing opportunities and experiences for children to discover and develop talents and to be inspired. That is why, as well as upgrading buildings and supplying resources, we also fund extracurricular activities and educational tours for pupils in our partner schools.

Achievements & plans

This year we provided funding for the Kiteghe Primary School drama club to produce a professionally shot short film as their submission to the annual school's drama festival. After agonisingly missing out on qualification for the regional level of the competition in 2015, this year they went all the way to the national final where they finished an incredible third out of 22 schools from across the country!

In August 2015 we also funded a three-day trip for 50 pupils from Kiteghe to visit Kenya's famous Rift Valley and Great Lakes region - a 500km, 12-hour bus ride from Kasigau. The children had the opportunity to see geographic and geological sites and features that they would otherwise only read about in textbooks. Both of these experiences are ones that the pupils could previously only dream of and we are delighted to support such activities across our partner schools.




In 2015/16 97% of expenditure was on charitable activities...

Record annual expenditure...

In 2015/16 our expenditure reached a record high of £186,247 with spending on projects and programmes accounting for £170,348 of this. Next year the proportion of expenditure on project management, fundraising and governance will increase, as the size of the charity now demands investment in these areas in the form of employee salaries, organisational infrastructure and other associated costs.

Organisational plans for 2016/17 & beyond

- The incorporation of the charity from a charitable trust to a charitable company including re-registration with the Charity Commission
- Our Director will become a paid, full-time member of staff having been running the charity voluntarily for a number of years, whilst we also plan to employ an additional part-time fundraiser
